



*Snow King Mountain Proves To Be Tall Order
For Jimmy John's Riders And Crew*



Winnipeg, MB (December 12, 2017) - The high altitude and steep slopes of Jackson Hole's Snow King Mountain made for a challenging weekend for the Jimmy John's/XPS/Ski-Doo team as riders and crew members struggled to adapt to the new venue.

Reigning Pro Lite Champion Aki Pihlaja was strong throughout qualifying. He finished 1-1 in his heat races on Friday earning a key starting position on the front row of the final. Pihlaja was pinched off at the start of the main event, but worked his way from seventh place up to fifth at the finish.



On Saturday, Aki once again qualified well finishing 2-2 in his heats. Unfortunately, he had a serious crash on the opening lap of the main event, getting pitch over the handlebars while launching over one of the large double jumps coming down the Snow King ski slope. Aki was uninjured but his machine was severely damaged and unable to continue.

Pro racer Ryan Springer is still grasping to find a comfortable setup and the fast and steep course in Jackson Hole did not aid his progress. Springer finished 11th in both Pro finals and is looking forward to the holiday break to spend extensive time



testing before the season resumes in January.

Up next is the Canterbury Park Snocross National presented by Jimmy John's on January 5-6 in Shakopee, Minnesota.
